TURNITIN

Montana Tech subscribes to Turnitin, text-matching identification software that can help instructors detect the presence of plagiarism, contract cheating, and Algenerated text in students' papers. Please note that the latter function does not preclude the permitted use of AI in assignment creation; instead, it opens up possibilities for critical thinking around the ethical and transparent use of AI-generated content in university coursework. Turnitin also simplifies remote assignment submission and comes with built-in electronic grading functions that significantly speed up the marking process. The next Turnitin training session is scheduled for **August 23** from 1:00 until 2:30 in Engineering Hall room 106. Please consider attending this session if you are curious about Turnitin's AI detection and grading tools, have never used Turnitin, or want a Turnitin refresher.

DRIVER'S SAFETY TRAINING FOR CAMPUS

This online/self-paced course, offered by Risk Management and Tort Defense (RMTD), is full of information on driving a large vehicle with occupants or gear for the university system. The course is designed to educate drivers on operating a wide variety of vehicles for MUS campuses. It expands coverage of defensive driving tips applicable to all motor vehicles while retaining information about the special techniques needed to safely drive the full-size sport utility vehicles and small buses still used by campuses. It also explains Board of Regents' driving policies and the stricter policies set by some campuses. Finally, it teaches what a driver should do if they are involved in a crash while driving on MUS business. The training is highly recommended if any MUS vehicle will be driven, and the training can be taken by any faculty, staff, or student of the university who can drive. Register here.

IDENTIFY PHISHING EMAILS AND SCAMS

As the new school year begins, please be extra vigilant in your efforts to identify phishing emails and scams. Historically we have seen an increase in this activity during this time. Here are some tips to help you stay safe:

- Create strong, randomized passwords by using a password tool like KeePass
- Set up two-factor authentication for all accounts that support it
- Be diligent about avoiding phishing scams
- Keep private information private
- Back up important files
- Keep software up to date on all devices
- · Delete old tools and unused accounts

FALL STUDENT EMPLOYMENT REMINDERS

As we enter the fall semester, here are some reminders about our Student Employment policies and procedures.

- A new <u>student employment certification</u> form must be completed for <u>all</u> students working during the Fall semester
- Student employees are not allowed to begin work until all necessary paperwork is complete and turned in
- When offering student wages, please refer to the updated Montana Tech Student Employment <u>Job Classifications and Wage Guidelines</u> located on our website
- Timecards will be printed and sent once the paperwork has been processed
- GRA/GTA students working during the fall will <u>not receive payment</u> until a new contract is submitted and processed. Please work with the Graduate School to ensure proper awards and contracts are completed
