CAREER PATHS

Occupational Safety and Health (OSH) graduates apply science and technology to anticipate, recognize, evaluate, and control safety and health hazards in the workplace. It is not uncommon for OSH students to complete three or more summer internships around the country. Our graduates enjoy a 95-100% placement rate in virtually every industrial sector, and the need for highly skilled OSH professionals continues to outpace demand. Some students continue their studies by pursuing a master's degree in industrial hygiene.

Overall employment of occupational health and safety specialists and technicians is projected to **grow 12 percent from 2024 to 2034**, much faster than the average for all occupations. (BLS, 2024)
